

Community Ski/Ride Days FAQ

>>>>New for winter 2025/2026!

Community Ski Days are the reintroduction to a surface tow operating at the historic Plumas-Eureka Ski Bowl. It has been more than 20 years since anything mechanical helped snow surfers up the hill at this historic Plumas County treasure.

This winter (weather and snow permitting) PSC announces the return of help up the hill: in the shape of an approximately 675' surface rope tow open to the public. As always, the Plumas Ski Club is humble on the mountain, we will start small and build from there.

The Ski Club is beyond excited to announce this multigenerational effort:

What: A rope tow, open to the public, three days (to start) from 10:00am-3:00pm, lift ticket donations accepted at the Intorf Lodge (Cash, Check, Credit/Debit accepted): for this season—cost/donation is exactly as it was when the last lift closed in 1997 \$24 for 18+, \$17 for teens and \$12 for kids aged 13 or under. —and commemorative original wickets and tickets are your proof of purchase. The Intorf Lodge will be open with a hot fire burning, food and beverages will be available, the coolest merch on the planet, who knows... maybe even some tunes. Things magically happen at the Plumas-Eureka Ski Bowl.

Who: Anyone is welcome to donate at ticket cost—but this is especially targeted to the kids (and kids at heart) of Plumas County. Folks of every fold of life have learned and enjoyed skiing at the Historic Ski Bowl, and continuing that legacy is the primary goal of the new rope tow. Scholarships are available on-site, nobody will be turned away for lack of funds to donate the ticket price. Tickets are available at the Intorf Lodge. The terrain is best suited to those skiers/riders with some experience.

When: Dates: 1/31/2026, 2/28/2026, 3/28/2026, lifts operate from 10am-3pm. These dates align with our Full Moon Ski/Ride and Party events, which kick off moonlight skiing, music and festivities at 4pm. Separate entry fees, etc apply. Bring cheap, sticky-palm work gloves to improve your rope tow experience!

Why: Everyone in Plumas County should enjoy the magic that is the Historic Ski Bowl, kids especially. This hill has taught countless snow skiers/riders that if you can hang with the Ski Bowl terrain, you can hang anywhere. We want to keep that tradition alive. We have big ideas—but are starting humble, a small rope tow—a small hill, but big things could be on the horizon... IF you get involved.
